I, W. S. Russell, do hereby certify that "Haskamp's Addition to Bisbee," is situated on the South Half of the North West Quarter of Section One, Township One Hundred and Fifty Nine North of Range Sixty eight West of the Fifth Principal Meridian, in Towner County, State of North Dakota, and consists of Blocks 11, 12, 13, 14, 15, 16, 17, 18, 19, 20, 21, 22 and 23, and Blocks B, C, D, E, and F, all as shown and set forth on the annexed plat thereof, the same being the whole of the aforesaid South Half of the North West Quarter of Section One except the right of way of the Great Northern Railway, the portion platted in 1897, as "Haskamp and Bergending Addition to Bisbee," and the lot extending 150 feet on Third Avenue West and 140 feet on Third Street at their North West corner as already deeded to the Presbyterian Church. Further, That said Plat is in accordance with a survey made under my direction in the month of June AD. 1902, That all regular lots in Block 12 to 16 are 50 feet front by 140 feet in depth, and like Blocks 17 to 23 are 25 feet front by 140 feet in depth. That the size of Lots and Blocks, the widths of the streets, avenue and alleys and the locations of the monuments are as noted thereon are in feet and decimals of a foot. That the survey was based on the monuments set in 1897 at the intersections of Second Avenue West with Haskamp Street and with Third Street, and at the Southwest corner of the of the quarter section, and that for additional points of reference in making all future surveys two new monuments were placed as follows, all as shown on the plat. In Fourth Avenue West at its intersection with Third Street, a 3/4 inch iron bar, 2 feet in length, driven its full length in the ground. In Fourth Avenue East at its intersection with Wall street a 3/4 inch iron bar, 2 feet in length driven its full length in the ground. All measurements were taken with a steel tape compared with a "Sance" Steel tape one hundred feet in length at a temperature of 62° Fahr. under a 12 pound strain. All of which is true and correct to the best of my knowledge and belief. Witness my hand this 19th day of July, A.D. 1902.
